

ART. 1 – AIMS AND DESTINATIONS OF ERASMUS+ MOBILITY FOR STUDIES



Student Mobility for Studies (KA131) is part of the Erasmus+ 2021/2027 programme Action 1.

This Call allows students to undertake a period of international mobility during their 1st, 2nd or 3rd study cycle at a Partner University that has signed a bilateral agreement with the University of Turin.





ART. 1.3 - MOBILITY FOR STUDIES - DESTINA





Partner Universities that are in one of the following two country groups:

- **Programme Countries including:** EU Member States, EEA countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway), acceding countries, candidate countries and potential candidates (Turkey, Serbia and the Republic of North Macedonia);
- Partner Countries including: all countries not part of Programme Countries group. NB UK and Switzerland are in this group.

Students enrolled at the University of Turin, <u>but not resident in Italy</u>, cannot carry out a mobility in a Partner University in their own country of residence.

ART. 2.2 – ACADEMIC PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

✓ To be duly enrolled at the University of Turin (UniTO) a.y. 2023/2024








ART. 3 – DURATION OF ERASMUS+ MOBILITY FOR STUDIES

- ✓ Minimum **2 months (60 days)** max 12 months
- ✓ Bilateral Agreement confirming the stay (4, 5, 8, 9 months)
- ✓ Ongoing Student Mobility *from* **June 1st 2023** *to* **30th September 2024**
- ✓ Possible extention (after arriving abroad)
- ➤ UG students 1st year: departure in the 2nd year
- > UG students 2nd year: departure in the 3rd year (if possible 1st sem.)
- ➤ UG students 3rd year: PG destination (graduation within 2023 + enrolment in a PG degree program of SME)
- > PG students 1st year: departure in the 2nd year (if possible 1st sem.)

Who manages the Erasmus+ Programme?

Implementation of the Erasmus+ Program is largely decentralized: the European Commission entrusts budget implementation functions to the National Agencies



How is the Erasmus + Programme regulated?

The legal basis which defines the Erasmus+ Programme is a Regulation approved by the European Parliament and Council







The contribution amount varies according to:

- 1. Destination country
- 2. Household income
- 3. Type of journey to and from Host University

If, however, the Swiss Government does not grant mobility contributions for the a.y. 2023/2024, the University of Turin will pay a monthly contribution equal to the amount due for Group 1 countries.

4. Erasmus+ Travel Contribution TYPE 2: Travel Green TOP UP



Travel grant intended for Erasmus Studio mobility beneficiaries a.y. 2023/2024 who will undertake a **green** trip in order to reach their destination and who do not receive "TRAVEL GRANT" grants (type 1).



The **Travel Green TOP UP** fund is for travelling distances up to 4,000 km:

- travel fund of a one-off payment equal to €50.00 (NO variable amounts based on distance);
- a daily allowance depending on the monthly scholarship (PART A/30 days + any PART B/30 days = daily amount due). This allowance is recognised for each day of environmentally friendly travel (in both directions) in order to reach the destination and for a maximum of 4 day.

Il **TOP UP Travel Green** will be paid after presenting **supporting evidence** of the actual environmentally friendly travel and time needed to reach the destination.





7.5 – PAYMENT METHODS AND TIMING

First payment

➤ During the first month (100% **A**)+ (70% **B** according to the economic requirement)

Second payment

➤ At the end of the semester: 30% **B** + TRAVEL GRANT or TOP-UP Travel Green, if applicable

Waiver / The student has to return the entire amount received if:

- > the student renounces to the Erasmus experience
- > the student stays less than 60 days abroad
- UniTO cancels the mobility due to a student's failure to comply with the obligations of the mobility contract they have signed

The student has to return part of the amount received if:

- > the student stays less than the period agreed by the Bilateral Agreement
- > the credits recognised by UniTO are less than 2 EU credits per month
- > the credits recognised by UniTO are less than 1 EU credit for dissertation research





EU SCHOLARSHIP +...

This Call mobility scholarship is:

- COMPATIBLE with other scholarships and/or grants from other funding bodies and/or scholarship providers, although the beneficiary (student) must check with them about the compatibility of Erasmus+ funding with any other funding claimed/received. The International Mobility Office does not have this information, so students must contact the relevant organisations themselves;
- INCOMPATIBLE with additional EU funds granted for the same purpose, namely to support international mobility.



PROOFS OF LANGUAGE SKILLS (P. 13 – ANNEX 1)

For each of the languages known, students will have to attach to the application one of the following proofs:

- a) proof of having passed the university language proficiency exam. The
 documentation relating to the exam must indicate the language, the date,
 the place and, if possible, the mark and credit value (Students can download
 self-certification of exams taken from MyUniTo).
- b) an international certificate (IELTS, DELF DELE, etc.). The certificate must show the year, the type of diploma and the mark (including any partial). Click here for a list of the certificates the SME School recognises.
- c) other language certificates or documentation suitable for proving language level (e.g. Esabac, SAC certificate, Passport for Europe, Transcript of Records (ToR) related to other mobility experiences proving that the student has passed exams in the local language, etc.). The documentation attached must indicate the year, the type of diploma, the mark (including any partial).
- d) Self-certification of being **mother-tongue speaker or bilingual, duly signed** by the applicant. The Evaluation Committee reserves the right to interview the student in order to check the self-certified language level.
- e) for students applying to an English-speaking destination: self-certification of being enrolled in a degree program held in English





8.2 - APPLICATIONS

The deadline for applications is **Friday 22 Dec. 2022 at 1.00 p.m.** Applications CANNOT be edited after this deadline.

- The procedure is complete once the student **has confirmed the application** and **printed out the PDF** of the Erasmus+ a.y. 2023/2024 final application form
- A **copy** of this receipt must be kept
- A printed copy of the draft is **NOT valid** for application. <u>Draft applications</u> <u>will not be considered without confirmation or printed copy of the final application form.</u>

PG 1st year:
$$A = \frac{(FG-70)}{43} \times 70$$

B = under 89 / 110: 0 points
over 89/110: 30 points

FG: final grade 43 (113-70) where 113 represents the highest mark degree and 70 the lowest mark degree





SELECTION - MERIT REQUIREMENTS

FINAL SCORE (B): 0 points 1st year UG

FINAL SCORE (A+B): max 100 points 2nd year UG and 1st year PG

Registration exams:

Before October 31st 2022 (for the 10 Ects and the weighted arithmetic mean)





Winner of the 1st ranking:

Students will be ranked from the highest to the lowest depending on their scores and considering – if possible – the destinations they chose.

Students who do not win a place will be given a reserved position on the list.

Eligible student:

After the acceptance or waiver the eligible applicant will be assigned to the destination of their choice, if available.





Eligible students for the 2nd ranking:

Applicant meet the call requirements, but due to the lack of places in the destination choices, the student will be assigned to the 2nd ranking. The Interuniversity office will assign students places taking into consideration their choice of linguistic area.
